CCTQA will help emergency medicine physicians develop the **clinical decision-making skills and quality assurance practices** they need in order to deliver high-quality care to patients. Emergency medicine (EM) continues to develop throughout the world as an essential part of any efficient healthcare system. This course is designed for emergency clinicians who are current or wish to be future leaders in European emergency departments. In addition to clinical emergency medicine, the course will also explore important leadership and systems-development strategies relevant to this growing field.
